TOURNAMENT CODE OF CONDUCT

For players, coaches, parents, and spectators



Hockey West Island is committed to providing an environment in which all individuals are treated with respect. Players and participants of the 2026 Hockey West Island U9/U11/U13 "FULLER CUP" Provincial Tournament shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner which promotes and encourages each player, with the principles of good sportsmanship and fair play being paramount.

During the course of the tournament, players, coaches, parents, and spectators shall refrain from comments or actions that are disrespectful, offensive, abusive, racist, or sexist. Hockey West Island will not tolerate behaviour that constitutes harassment or abuse.

PLAYERS are expected to:

- Respect all facilities, staff, and volunteers.
- Respect the officials and their decisions.
- respect their teammates, opposing team players, coaches, and other participants.

COACHES ARE EXPECTED TO:

- Respect all facilities, staff, and volunteers.
- Respect the officials and their decisions.
- Encourage sportsmanship, effort, and positive attitudes of all participants.
- Take responsibility for their team's actions and behaviour on and off the ice.

PARENTS/SPECTATORS are expected to:

• Display good sportsmanship. Cheer good plays of all participants. Please avoid excessive celebrations in the event that the score is very one-sided.

Remember that the players are children.

- Do not taunt or disturb other fans. Enjoy the game together!
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from hockey. Profanity and objectionable cheers or gestures are offensive and will not be tolerated.
- Help provide a safe and fun environment by not leaning over the boards or pounding on the glass. The glass surrounding the ice surface is part of the playing area.
- Respect locker rooms as areas reserved for players and coaches.
- Drugs or alcohol are STRICTLY FORBIDDEN in all arenas.
- Although we encourage you to support your team in a dynamic way, we remind you that in accordance with Hockey Quebec regulations (7.7.8) the use of compressed air horns or horns powered by a battery during games under the jurisdiction of Hockey Quebec are prohibited.
