This booklet contains the rules of the HOCKEY WEST ISLAND U9 portion of the PROVINCIAL TOURNAMENT, the procedure to follow for teams wishing to participate, as well as some information of general interest.

Our tournament is sanctioned and accredited by Hockey Québec. Tournament management applies the rules that are in effect in Hockey Quebec's administrative rules book. In the case of a dispute, the tournament director will rule and this decision will be final and without appeal.

When you arrive, the coach and/or manager must go to the registration desk to confirm the presence of their team and to be informed of the procedure to follow.

ONLY approved regular and affiliated players who appear on the team's official roster may participate in the tournament.

COACHING QUALIFICATIONS: Coaches must respect the qualifications required for their division (see Hockey Quebec administrative regulations 3.2).

All gamesheets will be electronic. A Coach/manager is required to confirm their line up with the registration desk before each game. If for any reason there are issues with the electronic game sheets, a paper scoresheet will be provided by the tournament. Only lineups and penalties are counted on the U9 match sheet.

The game rules are those of the [U7-U9 Organization Guide \(2025-2026\)](#) and the administrative rules are those of Hockey Québec in force for the 2025-2026 season.

U9 - FESTIVAL STYLE TOURNAMENT

3.1.4 Coaches

- At the U7 and U9 levels, each team will have to rely on the presence of **exactly 2 trained people behind the bench during a match.**

In line with the U9 program, the tournament is a participation tournament (festival style) and is non-competitive with NO SCORING OR RANKING.

U9 teams are guaranteed four games.

A team may play a maximum of two games per day.

Format of 4 vs 4 (players) plus one goalkeeper per team.

Ice surfacing will be done every two hours.

JERSEY COLORS: The home team will wear dark jerseys and the visiting team will wear light jerseys. According to the tournament schedule, the team marked in second position is the home team. Teams must always have both team jerseys in case of confusion.

DURATION OF THE PERIODS:

Game time will be allocated as follows:



Échauffement	2 minutes
1^{re} période	21 minutes
Pause	1 minute
2^e période	21 minutes*

Time may be less in the event of delays in the game.

DURATION OF SHIFTS:

Line changes are made every (90 seconds), the changes are made on an audible signal. No time outs will be granted. There is no overtime for this category as stipulated by Hockey Quebec rules.



U9 teams will receive a snack and a drink between their two games on both days (Saturday and Sunday). A choice of snacks and drinks will be made available to players in exchange for tickets given to the coach or team manager when the team signs in each day.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

PLAYER OF THE GAME: After each game, there will be the player of the game for each of the teams. A tournament volunteer will ask the head coach who will be the recipient from their team. The two teams line up opposite each other to receive the player of the game. The same player cannot be chosen twice.

DRESSING ROOMS: Rooms will be available 30 minutes before the game. After the game, you have 20 minutes to vacate the room. The team staff is responsible for leaving the room clean after the departure of their team (putting all bottles, tape or other in the trash).

Please limit the number of parents in the dressing rooms (ie: tie skates and exit). Preferably, only coaches and managers should be in the room.

RULES AND DISCIPLINE: The rules are the same as those governed by Hockey Canada and Hockey Quebec. Any player or team member who engages in prejudicial personal conduct will be expelled from the tournament.

ON AND OFF-ICE OFFICIALS: All officials are certified by Hockey Quebec. The duties and supervision of officials are governed by Hockey Québec and not the tournament committee. Please direct any questions regarding officiating to the supervisor assigned to our tournament.

HEALTH AND SAFETY REP: A team must have among its coaching staff, a health and safety representative. The person holding the qualification of health and safety officer (PSSH) in hockey must be part of the staff who acts at the team level behind the bench during a game.

FIRST AID KIT: (Hockey Quebec Administrative Rules art. 7.7.9) First Aid Kit: During any hockey activity, all teams must have a First Aid Kit at the players' bench.

SKATE SHARPENING: There may not be skate sharpening available. *Please ensure skates are sharpened before you arrive.*

CANTEEN: A canteen is available at Bob-Birnie Arena.



USE OF AIR HORNS: Although we encourage you to support your team in a dynamic way, we remind you that, in accordance with Hockey Quebec regulations (7.7.8) the use of compressed air horns or horns powered by a battery during games under the jurisdiction of Hockey Quebec is prohibited.

MISCELLANEOUS:


